Bethany Home started by caring and providing for the needs of the disabled. Those under its care were very much dependent on the caregivers, as they could not do much by themselves for basic daily living. From caregiving, Bethany Home advanced to providing quality training towards independent living. The Group Home Residential Programme is one among the significant platforms through which the Home has trained many towards Independent Living. Teaching Independent Living Skills has been one of the main areas in Bethany's curriculum. However, INTERDEPENDENT LIVING is the key word now. Bethany teaches Interdependent Living skills, a much needed skill in community living.

As Bethany's Training-Care model has shifted from Dependent Living to Independent Living, we now experience the blessings of Interdependent Living even more. Bethany has always been Interdependent. However, the lack of its awareness had resulted in some negative feelings among some · People, especially those with severe physical disabilities, expressed that they have been feeling very bad being on the receiving end all the time. When we assured them of their unique contri<mark>but</mark>ion to the people aroun<mark>d them and that the co</mark>mmunity needs them, they immedi<mark>ate</mark>ly felt good. Parents with disabled children too communicate that they feel good when we tell them we depend on them as much as they depend on us.

Bethany is Dependent on the donations and support from the general public. However, it has grown not to feel bad about asking and presenting its needs. We Depend on the staff and volunteers for the success of each programme e.g. Handicamps and Sports. Again, we do not feel bad about

being Dependent. Since we shoulder an important responsibility in providing care and educ<mark>ational training for the</mark> child<mark>re</mark>n with disabilities, we are pr<mark>oud</mark> of the fact th<mark>at we contribute to t</mark>he d<mark>ev</mark>elopment of the community <mark>and</mark> the nation· As we depend on each other, we experience interdependency· And at Bethany we experience it as something so very beautiful.


